Gospel Meditation

By Father John Muir

A young, engaged couple sat on the couch in front of me as we chatted about their upcoming marriage. The young lady was struggling to trust her future husband. She told me her father had been unfaithful to her mother. She said of her fiancé, "I want him to prove to me that he won't cheat on me." The young man looked at me helplessly, raised his eyebrows and shrugged his shoulders. What evidence could he possibly give to validate such a proof? Nothing. All he could do was invite her to trust him.

We all are wounded by experiences of imperfect love. We also are tempted to demand from God proof of His fidelity and goodness. We are like St. Thomas the Apostle who, on that second Sunday of Easter, demands proof of the Lord's resurrection. "Unless I see the mark of the nail ... I will not believe." Our science, technology and mathematics can indeed prove a great deal. But there are some things that require trusting another person.

We prove promises of love only by trusting.

St. Thomas indeed saw the wounds of Jesus and believed. But there is an even greater blessing for us who simply trust Him — and all the truths the Church proclaims — because of the trustworthiness of the Risen One who speaks.

This week let's trust Jesus without seeing him.

We hear how the original believers in the risen Jesus lived in peace and harmony in Jerusalem. What could you do to promote good-will and happiness in your community of friends or co-workers?

Second Reading

Peter speaks of a "new birth" of "indescribable and glorious joy" that awaits all believers "in the final time" (Jesus' Second Coming). How often do you think about your own resurrection from the dead?

Gospel

The risen Jesus says to Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."



Our purpose is to profess and proclaim the truth of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist, and to promote, insofar as possible, Perpetual Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacramento and the hourly offering of the Divine Mercy Chaplet for the dying; pray for and encourage vocations to the priesthood and the religious life and pray and work to end the scourge of abortion in the world. We pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet every day after 8:15am mass and at 3:00pm in the Adoration Chapel. We offer Bi-Monthly or Monthly group meetings called, "Eucharist Apostles of Divine Mercy (EADM) Cenacles" in Spanish and would like to begin Cenacles in English. In these cenacles we praise the Lord for his goodness and mercy...have prayers of thanksgiving.....and praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Meetings deepen our understanding of Church teachings by reading and discussing passages of scripture along with the Catechism of the Catholic Church and select passages from St. Faustina's Diary. We provide food for the following ministries:





Resolution: Come in touch with the passion/energy you feel to protect this most beautiful place, Earth. In what way(s) might you help sustain Earth's life?


