

#### **Gospel Meditation**

By Father John Muir
Matthew 11:2-11

When I was 11, I was riding my bike on a Friday night in Scottsdale, Arizona. I saw giant spotlights swirling in the sky. Something amazing had to be happening. I pedaled after them with excitement. Sweaty and tired, I arrived, only to find a used car lot. Bright lights, flapping banners, inflatable balloon men swaying wildly in the wind. I stood there, heart sinking. All that spectacle, and all my effort ... for this?

As life proceeds, we learn what it is like to pursue promising but fruitless searches. This week we hear Jesus ask the crowds regarding John the Baptist: "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind?" (Matthew 11:7). He's not just describing the crowd's mis-aimed pursuit. He's naming our tendency to chase after what's flashy but flimsy.

What are our swaying reeds? For me, it is endless video reels on my phone, worldly pleasures, entertainment in sports, and the good opinion of others. Inflated distractions that bend whichever way the wind blows.

But they can't satisfy my soul. What are your flimsy reeds?

John the Baptist wasn't a swaying reed. He was rooted, grounded, unafraid to speak the solid truth. The people went to see him because, deep down, they were starving for something real.

This Advent, the Church asks us to reassess: What are we really looking for? Are we chasing the dazzling but hollow? Or are we seeking what is solid and lasting — that which points to Christ?

What are you waiting for during this Advent season?

#### Gospel

In prison, John the Baptist seemed uncertain about who Jesus is. Who do you talk to when you have questions about Jesus?

Dear Parishioners,

Bishop Soto has responded to our request to move the Resurrected Christ, the Crucifix and Tabernacle.

Bishop Soto has granted permission for us to proceed with moving the Resurrected Christ into the Stations of the Cross Garden to serve as a reminder of the 15th Station: The Resurrection of the Lord. In return, the Crucifix currently there will move into the Church to serve as our reminder of his sacrifice. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) a crucifix should remain near the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations to remind us of the saving Passion of the Lord commemorated in the Holy Eucharist. During Mass, the processional cross will be placed in dignified place, so the fixed cross is the only cross used.

In addition, Bishop Soto has asked that the Tabernacle remains in its current place. Our Church was designed to have a permanent adoration space before the Tabernacle. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) the tabernacle should be placed where it "is truly noble, prominent, conspicuous, worthily decorated, and suitable for prayer."

To align our prayer postures with that placement we need to review when to genuflect or bow. When entering and exiting the Church Nave, we should genuflect in reverence FACING the Tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament resides. Once Mass begins, and throughout the Mass, our focus is on the sacrifice taking place on the altar and we BOW to the altar for reverence.

## Why Do We Do That? - Catholic Life Explained The Morning Offering

There are many variations of the Morning Offering, but all share the same purpose: to begin each day by offering oneself to God, along with all the experiences, struggles and blessings that the day will bring. The ancient Israelites practiced the bikkurim ("first fruits") as described in Deuteronomy, chapter 26. This was a ritual by which the first fruits of the harvest were offered back to God in a sacrificial act of gratitude and obedience. The theology behind the Morning Offering is similar: giving to God the first moments of each day. The most traditional form of the Morning Offering, attributed to Fr. François-Xavier Gautrelet, begins "O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day, for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart..." 


