Gospel Meditation

We are all familiar with the refrain, "You have put on Christ. In him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia!" In Baptism, we "put on" Christ. In putting on Christ, we put on all that Christ is and represents: hope, faith, and love. We are no longer bound to the sins and failures of the flesh, that part of us that resists God and relies exclusively on human means.

It also means that we are not in debt to our past, complete with its sins, failures, regrets, fears, and unfulfilled dreams. There is always hope. In putting on Christ, we put on God's vision for the world, for all of His children and for us. We have been given a road map to guide our paths and a blueprint to follow for our life's journey.

There is no need for regret, and we are not tethered to our past. Is there anything in your past that you regret? Any decision or memory that continues to haunt you? We have all made mistakes, and we have this uncanny ability to continue beating ourselves up over things we can no longer do anything about, except learn from them. To put on Christ means that I can now bring God's unconditional love to my hurtful memories and sinful choices.

With each new moment and every new choice, I can start clean and live in freedom.

Imagine adults when the disciples were preaching and baptizing. They came to baptism not really knowing who they were, with pasts that were broken, seeking to live the joy of the Gospel they heard spoken to them and wanting the love they saw witnessed in the lives of those who believed. What tremendous celebrations their baptisms must have been! They could now have the support of a community, full participation in the sacraments of the church, focus for their disordered lives, consolation, healing, and an understanding of what life is really all about.

Our lives are meant to be celebrations of the Spirit we have received in Baptism. How does that joy get expressed in and through you? When we truly understand that we have put on Christ, our burdens can become much lighter. It is odd that so many Christians look like they are carrying the weight of the world on their shoulders. Wouldn't it be wonderful if those weights could be lifted and joy experienced!

Scripture Reflections

First Reading

The prophet Zechariah envisioned a future king for the people of Israel who would rule the nations with justice and humility. How do you see these virtues as a strength in leadership?

Second Reading

Paul speaks of the promise of the resurrection from the dead for believers who reject the flesh and live according to the Spirit. What spiritual exercises do you practice that help reject the flesh?

Gospel Reading

Jesus praises his Father for the irony of the wise and learned who are unable to see what is revealed to the childlike. What does this tell us about the kingdom of heaven?

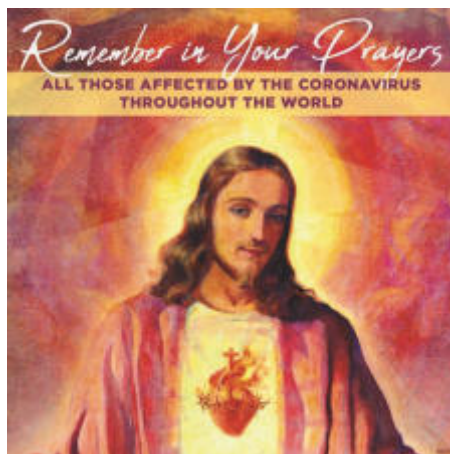

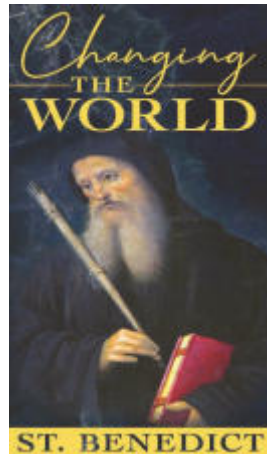

Young Benedict began his life with education and privilege but became disillusioned by a life pursuing material success. He withdrew to a monastery and spent much time in solitude. He began attracting followers, whom he organized over time into 12 monasteries, with a 13th established to train young monks. He wrote a rule of life including basic principles for living as Christ. His monks took three vows: conversion to Christ, obedience to the local abbot, and stability to remain with the community. Benedictine monasteries became lights in the darkness, secure centers of Christian culture enlivening the faithful their walls. When the world around us seems complicated and contrary to the Gospel, how will you be a light?

How Your Hidden Talents Can Change the World aleteia.org

If you feel invisible or ordinary, be inspired by these people you already know.

Emily Dickinson, the world famous poet, was virtually unknown during her lifetime. It's not just that her poems weren't published and that few people knew she had writing talent; when I say she was unknown, I mean she never left her room.

As a young woman, Emily went to school, spent time with friends, and even traveled a bit. As she entered middle-age, though, she became more and more reclusive. She began wearing only white clothing, never left the family home where she lived with her sister, and when a guest came to visit she would retreat to her bedroom until they left. She would leave the door open a crack to eavesdrop, but that was about it. The people of Amherst, where the Dickinsons had lived for generations, were aware that she existed, but they knew her mostly as a legend. She was the eccentric woman in the big house.

Even though Emily lived her quiet life in a small space, her inner life was very large. She kept up a lively correspondence with friends near and far, often sending them poetry and intensely emotional thoughts. She was an expert gardener with a vast array of knowledge about plants. She loved her family deeply and stayed engaged with all their comings and goings. After her death, her sister Lavinia and a family friend finally managed to publish a selection of her poetry, and the poems lit the world on fire. They were an immediate success, and today the name of Emily Dickinson is synonymous with artistic greatness. Her poems are studied and widely admired for their concentration of language and the vividness of her poetic vision. Her hidden talent didn't stay hidden forever.

There are many other stories like hers. St. Therese, called the Little Flower, lived a hidden life in a religious convent and died at a young age from tuberculosis. She was known only by the other women in her convent, and even within that small social group she was considered unremarkable. In fact, as she lay dying, she overheard two nuns wondering what the mother superior would find to say about her in the obituary because she had accomplished nothing remarkable. But then, after her death, her short autobiography became available. She had written it during her illness at the request of the mother superior and it revealed a simple but profound spirituality. Her Story of a Soul continues to be influential to this very day.

Vincent Van Gogh sold only a few paintings during his lifetime. The rest of his work was stored up by his brother, Theo. No one was interested in his art and he spent his entire life unappreciated. He had few friends, was considered mentally ill, and died of a mysterious gunshot wound acquired while painting in a wheat field. His paintings were only beginning to gain recognition at the time of his death.

Gerard Manley Hopkins, the Jesuit priest who seemed like a harmlessly eccentric failure during his lifetime – he was the sort of person who would get on his knees and stare at a bug – was after his death revealed to be a poet of enormous talent. His fellow Jesuits would laugh at him as the odd fellow they didn't quite know what to do with. The whole time, however, it turns out he was nurturing a secret, gorgeous vision of the world. Reading his poetry was highly influential on my own decision to become Catholic, and I know that his work is held dear by many others. In fact, I currently do editorial work at a magazine called Dappled Things, a phrase directly quoted from one of Hopkins's poems.

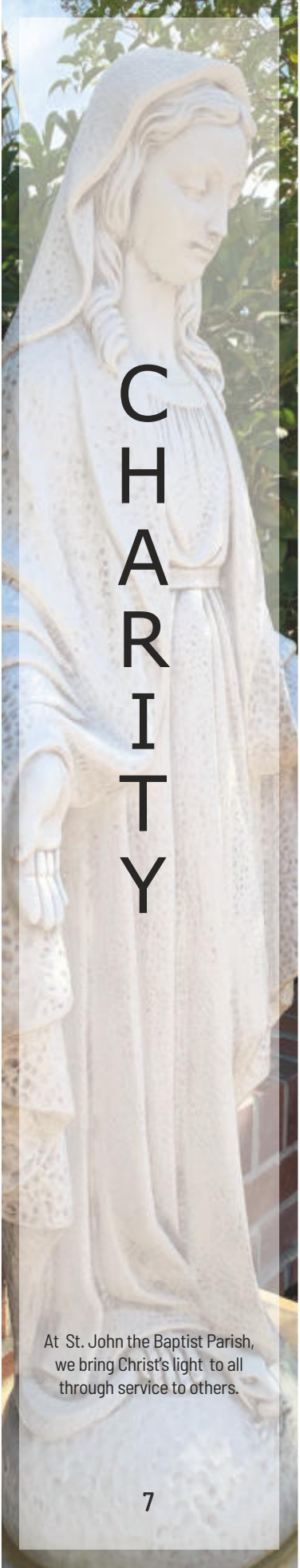
I'm sure I could continue to list the stories of people who nurtured hidden talents. I just listed a few who gained fame after their death, but it seems to me that there are many other secret heroes, probably as many people as who have lived. Each one of us has value, gifts, and hidden talents. It isn't just artistic talent or a thing you do, it may be a part of who you are, a particular quality of kindness or generosity, commitment to family, faithfulness in prayer, willingness to quietly suffer for others. Other people may not notice it, but don't let that discourage you.

What's your hidden talent? It's valuable as an expression of who you are. Fame doesn't matter as much as we think it does, and success isn't measured the way we think it is. Our hidden talents are practiced quietly for sheer love. Maybe they will someday change the world in a very noticeable way, but much more importantly our existence will still have changed the world for better or worse. I say we strive to make it for the better. Nurture those talents, add beauty to the world, and leave behind a lasting legacy.

Have you heard of the patron saint of purity? Born to peasant parents in southern Italy, St. Maria Goretti was a devout girl whose life was marked by difficulty. Her father died when she was nine, leaving her single mother with six mouths to feed. Two neighbors helped on the family farm, including a young man named Alessandro. He began making crude comments towards Maria. She repeatedly denied him. After several years, Alessandro attacked Maria to force himself on her. She resisted and, in his anger, Alessandro stabbed her. Maria died from the wounds' infections, but her last words were "I forgive Alessandro Serenelli, and I want him with me in heaven forever." While he was in prison, Maria appeared to Alessandro with a bouquet of roses, one for each wound he inflicted. In a true miracle of mercy, Alessandro experienced repentance, became a Franciscan brother after his release, and was later present at Maria's canonization.

Faith Like a Child

If you Google Search recommendations on how to raise generous children, almost every list of ideas begins with — or at least contains — the directive for adults to be good models of generosity themselves. Our children learn from our actions much more than from our words. Of course, when I think back over the years while my children were growing up, I think I may have learned as much from them as they learned from me. There is a time between early childhood and middle school where a child seems to be freer to give and share than at any other time in life. It is around the age of First Communion when the cries of "mine" turn to laughter and smiles, and the urge to be a part of something bigger than oneself leads to sharing. Before you know it, the child hits the pre-teen years, and once again, he or she becomes the center of the universe.

I believe that the previous paragraph is all true, however, the stages described seem to repeat themselves throughout adulthood. Don't you agree? Sometimes we fall into seeing ourselves as the center of the universe, or we become consumed by our state in life or with what we have acquired. Also, we at times are generous and loving people. It is sin that draws us back into ourselves and away from any meaningful life of stewardship and generosity. In order to be freed for love, we need role models to help us see what really matters. We need to reflect on the example of many of our brothers and sisters in Christ. And, yes, we need to look to children who may be at the point in their lives where sharing is fun, and love is something in abundance.

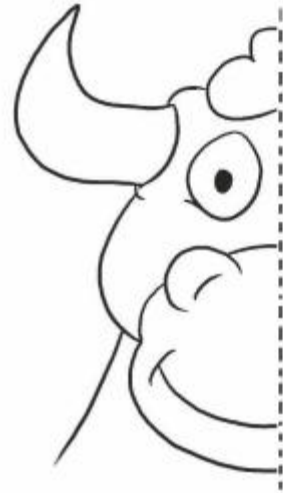

What is Lectio Divina?

How is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?

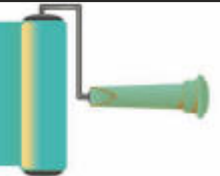
