Gospel Meditation

God gives us an invitation to have an abundant life. The banquet is ready, and the tables are set. Come! There is so much to attend to in the everydayness of our lives. We have plans, after all. There is never enough time and so much that needs to be done. There is work, children, and grandchildren, paying the bills, planning for retirement, figuring out the details of our next vacation, making sure we are on top of our game with work, planning social engagements, answering emails, texts, and getting our latest pictures on Facebook. There is always something. What is this about some banquet?

I need another party and commitment like a hole in the head. I can't manage what I already have, and someone is asking me to do more! Seriously? I saw the invitation; I think it came in the mail the other day. Did I leave it on the table? Oh wait, it may have gotten thrown away. I can't remember. In any case, I'm managing things pretty well on my own, I think. Thanks for thinking of me, but no thanks. My life is only as good as I make it and I have to be sure that all is in order! Oh, another invitation came today! This guy's being persistent. Now, I'm getting angry. I wish he would just leave me alone and stop with this invitation nonsense.

I woke up feeling a bit unsettled this morning. The kids have left the house, the grandchildren are busy with their lives, my retirement fund is losing ground, I'm worried about my health, folks have moved away, and I find myself alone. I am unhappy. I remember getting an invitation some time ago to a banquet promising new life and life in abundance. Did I miss something? I think I may have. I am finally discovering that life is not about me and my world. I think I've ignored the God who made me and the God who is the reason for my life, my hope, and my joy. It's always been about me. This allows the cleaning crew to sanitize the entire church prior to the next service.


For the time being, the daily Mass schedule stays the same:





"I need nothing but God, and to lose myself in the heart of Jesus." St. Margaret Mary Alacoque Feast Day: October 15



Ignatius of Antioch

What example does he offer us in Christian living as we celebrate his feast day?
As Bishop of Antioch (the modern day city of Antakya, Turkey), Ignatius witnessed to the faith during the

reign of Emperor Trajan, who ruled from 98-117. Persecution of Christians broke out in Antioch, and Ignatius was captured and taken to Rome for martyrdom in the arena. On his journey to Rome over land and sea, Ignatius writes seven letters to various churches. These letters give powerful glimpses into the theology and practice of the early church, along with insights into the role of a bishop as pastoral leader. Ignatius is the first to use the term "Catholic Church" to refer to the various Christian communities of the Roman Empire. The best known of his letters is the one he wrote to the Romans. Ignatius addresses influential Christians who might be tempted to intercede on his behalf, thus sparing him from martyrdom. He advises them against it, being resolute in his desire to be the "wheat of God." Eucharistic links are most evident in his words. As Christ willingly offered himself as witness to God's total love, Ignatius, too, desired to be "food for the wild beasts," so that he could become "the pure bread of Christ." Eucharistic living was so crucial to Ignatius that he was willing to die in order to model himself on the Lord who willingly offered all. Reflect on how you can use Ignatius as a model in your own eucharistic life of faith.



Stewardship of Treasure the Lord Has Entrusted to Us

Born in 1174, Hedwig was one of eight children born to the Count of Andechs and Duke of Croatia and Dalmatia. She was educated at the monastery of Kitzingen, and according to an old biography, at the age



of twelve (1186), was married to Henry I of Silesia. Henry I was an energetic prince, who greatly extended the boundaries of his duchy. Hedwig exercised her great influence in the government of the land through her prudence, fortitude, and piety. In particular she gave her support to new monastic foundations and assisted those already in existence. It was chiefly through the monasteries that German civilization was spread in Silesia. At the instance of his saintly wife, the duke then founded at his own expense, and on ground donated by himself the convent of the Cistercian nuns at Trebnitz in 1202, and generously endowed it.

The couple had seven children. After her husband's death, Hedwig took the grey habit of the Cistercians, but was not received into the order as a religious, that she might retain the right to spend her revenue in charities. The duchess practiced severe mortification, endured all trials with the greatest resignation, with self-denying charity cared for the sick and supported the poor. Her piety and gentleness won for her even during life, the reputation of a saint. She died on October 15, 1243, and laid to rest in the church attached to the Monastery at Trebnitz. Many miracles were wrought through her intercession that Pope Clement IV proclaimed her a saint on March 26, 1267 and on August 25 of the same year, her remains were raised to the honors of the Altar.

This servant of God, never neglected the practice of all good works. She had the power to relieve the bodily and spiritual troubles of all who sought her help. St. Hedwig is the patroness of brides, death of children, difficult marriages, victims of jealousy, widows and duchesses.




