Gospel Meditation

A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It surprised me because he is dedicated to evangelization, and yet he struggles with openness to new Catholics. It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who become new members of the Catholic community. Almost unconsciously I reduce the world to the categories of "us" and "them." The result is that meaningful community silently shrinks in my life.

Don't we all do that to some degree?

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. "Which did the will of his father?" asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They — like us — intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. Everyone is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't them. They are us. And Jesus wants all of us working in his boat, no matter the rocking.

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

The Vineyard

The second son never showed up to the vineyard. Did he get lost? Did he get tired? Did he not know where to begin?

When it comes right down to it, good intentions amount to very little. We all know this, don't we? "Show me, don't tell me." "I'll believe it when I see it." It's as true in the workplace and in relationships as it is in the life of the Christian disciple.

It doesn't matter if we intend to work in the vineyard. It doesn't matter if we promise to, if we think about it a lot, or if we make grand plans for what we will accomplish there. None of that matters if we don't show up. Before we show up, we have to find the way.

Showing up is the whole point. The work is the point, not the intention.

But all this begs the question: what does the work mean for us as baptized Catholics in the modern world? Spending our Saturdays in soup kitchens and homeless shelters? Standing on a street corner shouting out the words of the Gospel?

Our baptismal call is to the vineyard. Where is our vineyard? How do we show up? We are ready, Lord, we say. We intend to work. But where do we go?

My vineyard is not your vineyard, and so it's not my place to tell you how to get there. I am glad you want to go, but you'll have to find your own way, just like I will. But I can tell you this: only one voice will lead you there. If you listen to it, you will find your vineyard.





Holy Men and Women from the Americas

Anne Thérèse Guérin was born on October 2, 1798, in Brittany, France. When she was ten, she received her First Communion and expressed interest in joining a religious community when she was older. At age 15, her father was robbed and murdered while traveling. Anne soon took on the role managing the family's property and gardens as well as caring for her younger sister and her grieving mother.



Due to the death of Anne's two brothers over the years and now, the loss of her husband, Anne's mother, Isabelle, fell into a deep depression. Anne attempted to enter a religious order five years later but opted to stay home on account of the needs of her mother. When Anne was 25, she finally received Isabelle's blessing and, in 1823, she entered the Sisters of Providence of Ruillé-sur-Loir in France. She professed her perpetual vows in 1831 and was given the religious name of Sister Saint Théodore.

Sister Saint Théodore served as an educator as well as in ministry to those in need while living in France. At one point she became seriously ill with what is thought to have been smallpox. She survived the disease. In 1840, despite her challenging health, she and five companion sisters set sail for the United States in response to a call for the Sisters of Providence to begin a ministry in Indiana.

Sister Saint Théodore and her companion sisters established themselves in Saint Mary-of-the-Woods, a small, remote village in the wilderness in Indiana. They founded the Sisters of Providence of Saint Mary-of-the-Woods and Sister Saint Théodore became the superior of the community, taking the name Mother Théodore.

During the time Mother Théodore served as leader of the congregation, the Sisters opened schools, orphanages, and free pharmacies, all over the region. She also was able to raise funds and oversee the building of an entire church as well as a convent for the Sisters. During her service the Sisters grew from it's original six members to include sixty-seven professed members as well as many novices and postulants!

Mother Théodore died at the age of 57. She was canonized on October 15, 2006, by Pope Benedict XVI and given the official name of Saint Theodora Guérin.

Why do we do that? - Catholic Life Explained Psychics and Mediums

Are Catholics allowed to visit psychics? Why or why not?

It's part of human nature to experience some sense of unease and fear about the future. This can lead some people to seek out the services of psychics or consult

horoscopes or turn to other occult practices or resources (e.g. Ouija boards or tarot cards).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is very clear that Catholics should avoid such practices: "Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone" (no. 2116).

Despite the uncertainties we might feel, we are called to have faith and trust in God, confident of God's desire for what is best for us. This means that we are called to surrender, to pray and to reflect on how we can best move into the future in hope, knowing that God is with us.
