#### **Gospel Meditation**

I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the voice of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, "They recognize his voice." He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers.

Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go.

It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak.

You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.

#### **Scripture Reflections**

#### First Reading

After his speech in Jerusalem, the crowds asked Peter, "What are we to do?" He replied, "Repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ ... and you will receive the Holy Spirit." How open are you to receiving the Holy Spirit?

#### Second Reading

Peter teaches us as followers of Jesus, we are called to be patient when we are suffering.

What value do you see in this practice?

#### Gospel

Jesus speaks of himself as the gatekeeper for the "sheep" (his followers) who are kept safe from strangers. When have you turned to Jesus in your life in times of trouble?

#### Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

#### Cut to the Heart

Everyone who has been married knows this feeling: you're in the midst of a disagreement with your spouse. You've really dug in your heels. You're ready to die on this hill. And you have the awful, heartbreaking realization that you are wrong. Whatever it is you're arguing about, you're wrong. You.

So where do you go from here? The only way forward is to own it. Fess up. Grab a fork and dig into that humble pie. It makes me cringe just to write about it, because it's the worst feeling.

I use the example of marriage because it's the one I'm most familiar with — my closest relationship, the one that teaches me the most about who I am and who God asks me to be. But this is a universal experience, and everyone — single or married, child or adult, lay or ordained — knows how badly it feels to realize that you're wrong. You're human. You messed up.

It is hard to recognize that the Christian life is one of ongoing repentance. It is painful to acknowledge the ways in which we are falling short, even as we strive to follow in Christ's example.

It can, in the words of today's reading, "cut to the heart."

But that feeling of despair is what propels forward motion. We have to allow ourselves to feel bad, that's the fertile ground of penitence. We are meant to have not just life, but life "more abundantly." Stasis isn't the goal. Baptism isn't the finish line.

Examining our conscience is hard. It cuts to the heart. It cuts to the truth.

#### Holy Men and Women from the Americas

Venerable Norbert McAuliffe was born John Francis Joseph McAuliffe in Manhattan, New York in 1886. He was orphaned by the time he was nine years old. After living in homes for children, he was inspired by a visit by Brother Stanislaus Keating of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart. Losing both parents at an early age, McAuliffe became exceedingly interested in the Brothers' work founding and operating orphanages around the world. At age 16 he entered into the formation house of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart in



Metuchen, New Jersey. He made his first vows in 1903 and took the name Norbert.


Immediately upon joining the Brothers, McAuliffe dove right into their educational mission and served all over the United States. He spent time in Mississippi, Washington, Louisiana, Indiana, and Oklahoma. In 1931, McAuliffe was assigned to lead the Brothers' first mission to Uganda. They opened schools in Gulu, Uganda and Brother McAuliffe quickly became known by the local people for his dedication to prayer and love of Jesus. They nicknamed him Dano Ma Lego, The Man Who Always Prays.

During the outbreak of World War II, Brother McAuliffe was forced to return to the United States and was assigned as the Director of the Brothers' formation center at Metuchen, New Jersey, where he was originally formed. During the difficult times accompanying WWII, those at the formation center lived off of the food that they grew and sustained an impoverished lifestyle. This time is remembered by those who worked and lived with him as a time of spiritual growth and blessings for those in the community.

In 1946, social stability allowed for Brother McAuliffe's return to his missionary work in Uganda. During this time, he continued his work in education and established a more permanent formation center for those wanting to enter the Brothers of the Sacred Heart. He went on to become appointed the Director-General of the congregation leading them throughout eastern Africa. They continued their development of schools and soon expanded to both Sudan and Kenya. By the time McAuliffe passed away, he had seen the congregation grow from six brothers to six African novices, 21 missionaries, and 53 African postulants. He was able to witness the first Ugandan novices take their vows and begin the work of carrying the Brothers' work forward with local ownership of the mission.

After he died in 1959, the Ugandan bishops invoked his name as an intercessor for the country. Pope Francis bestowed upon him the title of Venerable in the Church on May 19, 2018. Brother McAuliffe's legacy of constant prayer, charity, and educational opportunity lives on in the Brothers' work in East Africa to this day!





# Genuflecting & Kneeling Does it matter what leg you kneel on when genuflecting?

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it's an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting, becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist. In our tradition, although many have been taught or prefer to genuflect by placing their right knee on the ground, there is no prescribed way to genuflect. This is especially important to keep in mind if physical limitations or age make certain movements difficult for us.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.
