Gospel Meditation

When I feel down, I sometimes watch the famous "Double Rainbow" video on YouTube to feel better. It's hilarious. A young man camping in Yosemite Park sees two rainbows stretching across the sky. He bursts into a kind of ecstasy. "Double rainbow, all the way! Oh my God!" he announces. Then he starts to weep. He cries out, "What does it mean?" Beneath the humor of his glorious overreaction is the deep intuition we all have, I think, when we see the colorful bow in the sky. This Sunday, God sends a rainbow to Noah, and to us. What does it mean?

Long before YouTube had the double rainbow, Dante's medieval poem *The Divine Comedy* featured one in his image of paradise. Seeing two rainbows, he muses that one is born of the other. The bow is God's promise of peace. For Dante, it's even more: nature's encrypted image of the Trinitarian God. One visible rainbow (God the Son) is begotten of another usually invisible one (God the Father) united by invisible light between them (God the Spirit). Like invisible light, Trinitarian glory surrounds us in every moment — but Jesus has made it visible in his glorious body.

Lenten challenge: This might seem silly, but this Lent I invite you to find a rainbow and meditate on it. You might have to make one yourself, like this current desert-dweller will. Gaze on it. See there a natural gift from the Creator, saying to you, "Here I am! I will love and protect you, surrounding you in My glory." This Lent let's embrace that with confidence, rain, or shine.

Scripture Reflections

First Reading

God used a rainbow as a sign of his covenant with Noah and all living creatures to never again flood the earth. Are there some additional signs in your life of God's love for us?

Second Reading:

Peter taught that baptism serves as an appeal or pledge to God for a clear conscience. What leads you to an examination of conscience?

Gospel:

After a brief report of Jesus' temptation by Satan in the desert, we hear the first words of Jesus at the launch of his public ministry in Galilee: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." As we begin the Lenten journey, what are some temptations you plan to face this Lent?

Lent and the Flood

I would bet money that somewhere in your church this Lent, there's a bare tree branch draped in purple fabric and an empty bowl filled with rocks.

I'm not poking fun, the desert imagery that surrounds the season of Lent isn't a cliché — or if it is, it's only because clichés are essentially true. Lent is the desert. Lent is the wilderness. Lent is the time of less.

But what if Lent was also the flood?

It seems counterintuitive, floods are excessive, and we don't think of Lent as a time for superabundance. Lent is when we limit experiences outside of ourselves in order to limit proclivities within ourselves. Lent is not a time for anything to be washing over us, consuming us, carrying us away on a tide.

Unless...it is.

Consider the flood of the Old Testament. An act of destruction, yes, but also an act of purification. An endurance test for the soul, an epic trust fall exercise between God and Noah in which Noah had to ride the literal waves, clinging to life as God wiped away everything familiar. Everything sinful.

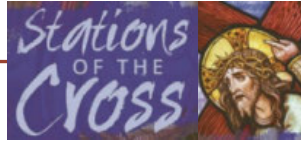
In Lent, we relinquish our weaknesses and our infirmities to the flood. It's frightening, certainly. But it's also exciting. Because just as the flood destroys everything, it also makes everything possible. It is a baptism.

Lent, like the flood, makes the world new.

Temporary change from Wednesdays to Mondays during February and March. Introductory welcome at 9:15 after morning Mass, prayer at 9:30. In February and March, we will offer a renewed focus on Jesus and His presence. We will continue to break open Scripture, using the same way of listening to the Word as offered in the Eucharistic Revival Program (ER). We will revisit the theme of each ER session the following week during our Companioned Prayer gathering. We will continue to focus on Jesus' presence in prayer, in us, the Word, and especially the Eucharist.

Vocations Cross Program

Who will bring Christ to us through the Eucharist at Mass? Who will baptize our children into the Catholic Faith? Who will hear our confessions and be at our sides when we die? Who will perform the marriages of our children and grandchildren? Who will preach the Gospel to us and teach us to be good as Christ asks?

This weekend we invite our parish families to participate in the Vocations Cross Program. It is our hope to support the Church in her effort to pray for priests and for an increase in priestly and religious vocations. Each weekend a family will have the opportunity to embrace praying for vocations at home together.

- The family will be asked to sit up front and to approach the Altar when Father asks for "the family who will take the Vocations Cross" to come forward. They will receive the kit (cross and prayers) and a special blessing.
- For one week the individual or family takes the Cross into their home and commits to saying the prayers provided on a daily basis.
- The kit is then returned the following weekend and will be passed to a different family.
- The Knights of Columbus will be coordinating this ministry. If you would like to take the cross home, please seek out the Brother Knight for the Mass you are attending.

Inspiration For the Week
In the desert, Jesus endured forty days of hardship and temptation. But he did not endure it alone: "the angels ministered to him," the Gospel tells us. Remember that you do not face Lent alone. God is beside you in your journey to the desert.



All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten, but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges.

What is 40 Cans For Lent?

A Knights of Columbus charity program that connects traditional Lenten alms-giving with the nutritional needs of poor families and homeless in the greater Folsom area. It has been a huge success inspired by Christ's 40 days of fasting in the desert.

The Program Is Simple

Collect cans of food and/or packaged food items each day during the 40 days of Lent.

What food should I donate?

- Healthy, non-perishable food
- Items with intact, un-opened, consumer or commercial packaging
- Items with non-breakable packaging (no glass please)
- Food within the expiration date on the packaging

What are the most requested food items?

- Canned meats like tuna, chicken, turkey, ham, stew and chili
- Canned vegetables
- Pasta & pasta sauce, Beans, Rice
- Healthy cereals, Peanut Butter
- Baby food & baby formula

Drop off food items in our Knights of Columbus "40 Cans for Lent" cart located outside in front of the church entrance before and after every weekend Mass. Items can also be dropped off at the St. Vincent De Paul location Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 am to 12 Noon.

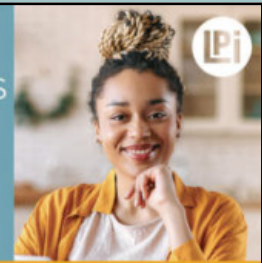

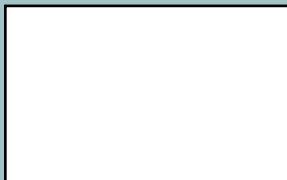

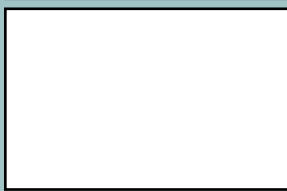
