### **Gospel Meditation**

By Father John Muir

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?"

For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist.

This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic.

It's our participation of love in the one we love.

### First Reading

### Second Reading

Paul teaches the Corinthians that through the body and blood of Christ, the community of believers are "one body." Who in your life needs to hear this unifying message?

#### Gospel

Jesus teaches the crowds that through his body and blood believers will obtain eternal life and be raised on the last day. This is the core of our Catholic belief about Jesus.







Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

#### The Priesthood and the Eucharist

"These two Sacraments were born together," wrote St. John Paul II of the priesthood and the Eucharist, "and their destiny is indissolubly linked until the end of the world."

The Eucharist is such a beautiful example of how God, conscious of our limitations, bends to meet us. He once came to us cloaked in the flesh, that we might recognize Him. Now He comes as the very means by which we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the most familiar and comforting thing in the world to us. How easy He makes it to fulfill his command that we become one with Him. How generous He is to make such a sacred thing also accessible.

We can say the same of the priesthood, and of the men He calls to its number. How generous of Him to make such an accessible thing — our sons, our brothers, our uncles, our cousins — sacred. How generous of Him to allow these human creations — who share in our own faults — to be the means through which He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Without the Eucharist, we would have no eternal life. Without priests, we would have no Eucharist. On this, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let's give thanks for our priests, and redouble our prayers that God will send us good and holy ones — manna from Heaven in our wandering exile.

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." — John 6:54



### Holy men and women from the Americas

Venerable Mario Hiriart Pulido was born in

Santiago, Chile, in 1931. Born with fibroids on his neck and torso, he had to undergo multiple surgeries throughout his life. He was educated at Catholic schools and, after graduating with the highest honors, entered the Faculty of Engineering at the Catholic University of Chile.

In his early adult life, he learned about the Schoenstatt Apostolic Movement and became its champion in Latin America. The Schoenstatt movement was founded by Father Joseph Kentenich as an effort to involve lay people in apostolic work and unite various factions of the Catholic church under the mantel of Mary. The movement invited men to dedicate their lives to the guidance of Mary, mother of God, and to live out their years in service to the church and their communities.

After receiving his engineering degree and teaching for a time, Mario spent 3 years in formation with the Schoenstatt movement in Brazil. During that time, he led a silent and prayerful life, thoroughly working through the Schoenstatt spirituality and committing himself to the Secular Institute of the Schoenstatt Brothers of Mary in Brazil. Following his personal consecration to Mary in the shrine of the Bellavista in Chile, as a civil engineer and devout Catholic, he wanted to help shape the world, stating in a letter that, "I want to be a personified encounter between heaven and earth!"

In his early 30's, Mario was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer. Upon hearing this sad news, Mario stated, "Interesting, interesting ... Since my youth, I have had the desire to die at the same age as Christ was when he died." He passed away while in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for chemotherapy treatment at age 33, the same age Jesus was when he was crucified. Pope Francis conferred on him the title of Venerable in 2020.





