#### **Gospel Meditation**

When I was in second grade, my prized possession was a metal Star Wars-themed lunch box. After school one day, another student ripped it from my hands. I helplessly watched in horror as my classmate threw it to the ground and violently stomped it into an unrecognizable heap of junk. I came home covered in tears of shame and rage. After a few months, I never thought about it again ... until I was almost thirty years old and on a retreat to prepare for ordination to the priesthood.

That childhood memory — and the attendant outrage — came back afresh. My spiritual director helped me in the process of acknowledging that I was angry because that kid owed me my lunch box. Then she helped me, through the grace of Jesus, to forgive the debt. Almost immediately I felt a new peace. I was amazed that I hadn't forgotten what I had lost, even from years before. Aren't we human beings simply amazing at remembering what people owe us?

We see this week in Jesus' parable a servant who is forgiven much but then commands another servant: "Pay back what you owe!" He can't forget or let go of how he was wronged. He remembers — and he becomes a monster because of it. If only he had remembered not only the debts owed to him, but also his greater debt owed to — and forgiven by — his master. It's natural for us to remember what others owe us. But when we contextualize those offenses in Jesus' mercy toward us and them, we're free to be merciful like the Master and less like a monster who never forgets

#### **Scripture Reflections**

#### **First Reading**

Sirach teaches that the Lord desires us to be forgiving and merciful to each other. In doing so, the Lord will show us mercy and forgiveness in return. To whom could you show mercy and forgiveness this week?

#### Second Reading

Paul instructed the Romans that Jesus was the Lord of all — both the living and the dead. How should this reality impact our daily living?

#### Gospel

Jesus tells the parable of the unforgiving servant to teach the disciples the importance of compassion and forgiveness, especially toward those who sin against you. How do you deal with friends or co-workers who have wronged you?

#### The Hateful Things We Hug Tight

At the end of "Lord of the Rings: Return of the King," Gollum fights with Frodo for possession of the One Ring. He wins the fight, but in doing so topples over the edge of the mountain ledge, falling into the cavernous fires of Mount Doom. As he falls, we see him smile, and clutch the ring to his chest. He is happy. He has won what he spent his life pursuing.

It is only in the last millisecond before his face slips below the lava that we see his eyes widen in terror as he realizes the truth: the thing he clutches to his heart is the thing that killed him. In choosing the ring, he chooses death.

Sin, and the fallen nature of this world, makes us addicted to something that kills us.

Like any addiction, it is a vicious cycle. The less we forgive, the more hardhearted we become ... and the less we seek forgiveness ourselves.

What breaks the cycle? Reconciliation with God — or, Confession, as we call it. In fact, it does more than break the cycle. It turns it backward. Not only does it detoxify our souls of sin, it weakens our addiction to sin's effects — anger, vengeance, unforgiveness. The confession of evil works is the first beginning of good works, said St. Augustine.

Ultimately, I view our whole human life as a struggle on the ledge of a mountaintop. It is certain that we will choose sin — we always do. We will tumble over the side, toward ruin. But let us be Frodo, and not Gollum. Let us cling to the rock of the sacraments and accept the hand that would drag us away from the flames.



#### Holy Men and Women from the Americas

Juan Bautista and Jacinto de los Ángeles were both born the same year, in 1660, in the town of San Francisco Cajonos in Oaxaca, Mexico. The boys grew up together in their Zapotec tribal community with de los Ángeles descending from a long line of tribal chiefs. The boys were raised Catholic and were altar servers in their youth. Both married, had children, and actively participated in their Catholic faiths.

During the centuries that Spanish missionaries were spreading Catholi-

cism in the Americas, and when Spain was actively trying to subjugate Mexico, Catholic missionary priests would appoint local converts as moral authorities in their communities. These deputized fiscales, or marshals, were tasked with upholding both civil and religious laws and reporting information back to the priests and bishops. Indigenous men were banned at the time from becoming priests themselves due to the Spaniards' inability to incorporate the natives' culture into the strict life habits of the Spanish friars. Thus, the highest religious position that a native man could be appointed at the time was that of fiscales. Both Bautista and de los Ángeles were appointed fiscales and revered in their communities as lay catechists, often also aiding the local priests in church affairs.

In 1700 when both were about 40 years old, while doing their rounds as fiscales, they learned that a local man named José Flores would be holding a ritual featuring native idols in his home. The men alerted the Dominican priests to whom they reported and were instructed by the priests to intervene. During the ceremony, Bautista, de los Ángeles, and some of the Dominicans disrupted the ritual and surprised those participating. As the men were well known in the community, many of the participants covered their faces and ran from the home, not wanting to be identified. The idols and other items used in the ritual were confiscated.

Word of retaliation against Bautista and de los Ángeles caused them to seek refuge and hide in the Dominican friary. That evening, an angry mob stormed the church with weapons and threatened to kill everyone inside if the two men weren't handed over. When the Dominican priests refused, the mob burnt down Bautista's nearby home and threatened to burn down the entire church and friary with everyone inside if their demands were not met. Both men decided to give themselves over to the mob to end the brutality and save the lives of everyone else. Before leaving they asked the priests to hear their confessions and administer the Eucharist to them. They then went out to confront the mob and were abducted while yelling back to the priests "Fathers — commend us to God!"

The mob brutalized the men and demanded that they denounce their faith. Despite the torture, neither did. The following day, the mob took them to a large hill near the village, beat them and threw their bodies down the hill. The Dominicans recovered their bodies and buried them at Villa Alta. In 1889 both men's bodies were moved to the Oaxaca Archdiocesan cathedral. In 2001, theologians confirmed that Bautista and de los Ángeles were murdered in hatred of the faith and Saint Pope John Paul II approved their cause and beatification on August 1, 2002, during his apostolic visit to Mexico.


