Gospel Meditation

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

Scripture Reflections

First Reading

The Lord responded to the prayer of Moses with the miracle of water from the rock for the Israelites to drink. What might you ask from the Lord this week?

Second Reading

Paul speaks of having "hope" because "the love of God has been poured into our hearts though the Holy Spirit." How does your faith in Jesus give you hope?

Gospel

Through her dialogue with Jesus, the Samaritan woman comes to the realization that Jesus is the Messiah. In her joy, she tells other Samaritans about her encounter with Jesus. How can you share your faith in Jesus with others?



St. Patrick, the Apostle of Ireland, is known throughout the Western world. He is called an apostle since he was the first missionary to the Irish people. And the Irish missionaries - both priests and women religious -- were among the first missionaries to the church in California. As a young man, Patrick was captured and enslaved for six years; he escaped, but felt called to go back to Ireland to proclaim Christ. There he established churches and primitive monasteries. Statues of St. Patrick can be seen at the entrance to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, as well as within the Cathedral, near the chapel of the Eucharist.



Lenten Rites for RCIA

This Sunday, March 12th, we celebrate the first of three Scrutinies. Scrutinies always take place on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays in Lent. Scrutinies are for the Elect, those to be baptized, confirmed and receive First Eucharist at Easter Vigil. You may be wondering what a scrutiny is now.

The Scrutinies are meant to uncover and then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out and then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. These rites are celebrated in order to deliver the elect, and indeed all of us, from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life.

On the 3rd Sunday, we will also present them with the Creed. The Creed is the tenets of our faith. In ancient times it was very guarded and not shared until the Elect were deemed ready. You in the assembly will present the Creed to Amita, Walter, Tyler and Lynsey at the 11:30am Mass on March 12th. Noe already shares the Creed with us as a baptized Catholic.

Let us all pray for our Elect on this next step in their faith journey towards Easter Vigil.
