Gospel Meditation

Jesus' parables are much stranger than most people realize. This week is an attention-getting example. He tells the religious leaders a parable about a completely absurd situation. Blood-thirsty and insane tenants violently abuse and kill the servants of their landlord. Inexplicably, the owner keeps sending them more victims of increasing value — up to and including his own son. Weird.

Usually, we hear this parable and assume it's an allegory: Jesus is the murdered son, the servants the prophets, etc. Fair enough. But notice — and here is where the weirdness deepens — Jesus seems to disagree with the Pharisees' interpretation that the landowner should and will punish the inheritance-obsessed murderers. So, is Jesus praising the psychotic and greedy murderers?! You can imagine the furrowed brows and deriding laughter as the scoffing crowd shuffles away.

If we stay with this tough parable, perhaps this truth emerges: God wants us to have an over-the-top obsession with a totally undeserved inheritance. Of course, we are forbidden to use violence. But the parable's violence gets our attention because it highlights the crazy goodness of the landowner. Jesus reveals that God is not merely in the business of rewarding the good and punishing the bad. He is playing a much stranger game — one marked by a kind of over-the-top mercy, a breathtaking giving of what is not deserved. What would our week look like if we embraced this kind of desire for God's kingdom on earth, even if others think we're nuts? This week let's seek God's kingdom with a passionate confidence in God's desire to give the good things we don't deserve

Paul teaches the Philippians that prayer and a positive attitude is key to settling our anxious hearts and minds. What have you been anxious about this week that using Paul's advice could help?

Gospel

In the parable of the tenants, Jesus harshly criticizes the chief priests and elders of Jerusalem and traps them with their own judgment. How well do you accept legitimate criticism?

Holy Men and Women from the Americas

Alphonse Gallegos was born on February 20, 1931, in Albuquerque, New Mexico. One of 11 children, he struggled with vision problems as a child but, after many surgeries, his myopic condition partially healed. While serving as an altar server at his parish, he came to know the Augustine Recollects. He joined as a novitiate and relocated to Kansas City, Kansas when he was 19.

While in formation, he continued to struggle with eye issues which caused him to become nearly blind. His condition delayed his ordination as his superiors worried that his disability might impair his ability to serve. Gallegos' worked hard to prove to them that he was able and succeeded in being ordained to the priesthood as a member of the Augustinian Recollects in 1958. Following his ordination, he served as a hospital chaplain and at various parishes until he eventually moved to Sacramento, California and was appointed the Director of the Division of Hispanic Affairs of the California Catholic Conference.

Two years after this appointment, in 1981, Father Gallegos was ordained auxiliary bishop for the Diocese of Sacramento. In 1983, he was also appointed as pastor of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. While serving in his community, he befriended countless neighbors and community leaders as well as those who were underprivileged and in need. He championed minority groups in his community and also belonged to his local chapter of the Knights of Columbus. In the evenings he would minister to gang members and those at risk in the impoverished neighborhoods of Los Angeles and Sacramento wearing a 99-cent sombrero and a t-shirt to fit in. He became well loved by the region and was affectionately called the Bishop of the Barrios which can be translated to the Bishop of the Neighborhoods and was welcomed as a chaplain-of-sorts for migrant workers and the city's lowrider car community.

On October 6, 1991, at age 60, while pushing his stalled car to the side of the road with his volunteer driver steering, Bishop Gallegos was struck by another vehicle and thrown 50 feet, dying instantly. His funeral procession included some 300 lowrider cars and hundreds of his friends and neighbors. The city of Sacramento named a section of Eleventh St. the Gallegos Square in his memory. In 2016, Pope Francis recognized Bishop Gallegos' heroic virtues and named him Venerable. Of his own legacy Bishop Gallegos said, "I would like to be remembered as having helped the young people to appreciate who they are and to value the life God has given them. I would also like to be remembered as having appreciated people and all that they have to offer in making the world a better place to live in."





This is a long, overdue thank you and update to you: our parish family and supporters. We had a fifth Sunday collection in July which resulted in more than \$5,000.

The number of families that we are serving has increased. We are welcoming families from other countries i.e. Ukraine, Russia, Cuba, Guatemala, etc. They not only come for food and clothing, but they are looking for resources to learn English and get a job. The number of individuals that we are feeding has increased from 400 per month earlier in the year to over 800 per month. This is not surprising given the cost of food. We encourage our working families to come so that they have the dollars for rent and gas among other needs. However, we are having a hard time serving them fully. We are still picking up food donations from Safeway three times a week and receiving food donations from Trader Joe's twice week. However, we are unable to accommodate all of our families fully on Fridays. We are continuing to look for options to satisfy the need.

You can help by supporting them through St. Vincent de Paul with financial and food donations. The non perishables that we include in a bag is cereal, macaroni and cheese, Cup of Soup, Top Ramen, canned tuna, canned vegetables, and canned fruit. We provide the homeless with canned meat (chicken, Spam and other cracker and meat packages). And please note that we have had an increase in non food donations i.e. clothing, linens, kitchen appliances and utensils that are also needed.


